

U-PICK FARMS

Find a u-pick farm in your area. Now, we admit this is a little work, but blackberry and blueberry picking at berry farms can be a lot of fun. Find a u-pick farm nearest you at <http://www.pickyourown.org/OK.htm>.

U-Pick Tips & Tricks from TravelOK.com

Here are some tips and tricks for getting the most out of your u-pick experience in Oklahoma.

Keep cool and arrive early.

Many u-pick farms have early hours, and it's best to get out when the Oklahoma sun is greeting you instead of at its peak in the middle of the day. The berries and fruit are freshest then, and you'll also get first dibs for being an early bird.

Don't forget your containers.

Bring a shallow container for picking so the weight of the berries on top won't crush the ones on the bottom. Some places provide picking containers and take home bags, so call ahead to double check. If you're driving quite a ways to get to a farm, a cooler will help your produce stay at its freshest on the ride home.

Come prepared.

The right attire is essential to remaining comfortable while picking berries. Don't forget to wear long sleeves,

pants and a hat. Bug spray and sunscreen are also good ideas as well as gardening gloves. Document your trip with a few snap shots on your digital camera too. Expert tip: Stretch out your back, legs and arms before picking to keep from cramping up while bending over.

Have a plan for your produce.

Read up on canning, making jam, freezing techniques or recipes for the produce you're going to pick in order to get the most out of your produce while it's at its peak.

Other general rules.

Follow the farms' rules on where to pick, how much to pick and when. If u-pick is by appointment, be sure to call ahead. Most importantly, if you need help or have questions don't be shy. The owners will be able to answer all of your questions on ripeness, growing seasons and so much more.

Blackberry and Blueberry picking season usually begins the 1st of June and usually ends the middle of July.

[SKILLET BERRY COBLER](#)

- 4 cups your choice of fresh berries
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup rolled oats
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 1/2 sticks cold unsalted butter, cut into cubes

1. Preheat oven to 375°F.
2. In a 10 inch cast iron skillet, toss together berries, sugar, 1/2 cup flour, cornstarch and salt. Smooth berry into an even layer.
3. In a stand mixer with paddle attachment, add the 1 cup flour, oats, sugar, salt and cinnamon. Add the butter and mix until texture is coarse clumps and mixture will hold together in clumps when you squeeze it with your hand.
4. Spread topping evenly on top of berry mixture with your hand and press it down lightly.
5. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes, until the edges are bubbling and the top is golden brown. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream!

 - 4 medium tomatoes, diced
 - 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
 - 1 loaf unsliced French Bread
1. Mix everything together and refrigerate for about an hour.
 2. Bring to room temperature before serving. Cut bread into 24 slices; toast under broiler until lightly browned. Top with tomato mixture. Serve immediately.

- Strawberries
 - Microwavable dipping white chocolate
 - Blue crystalized sugar
1. Dip strawberry in melted white chocolate.
 2. Dip tip of strawberry in blue crystalized sugar.
 3. Lay flat on wax paper in refrigerator until chocolate is hard.
- Notes: Don't put these in the freezer to harden the white chocolate. You'll possibly freeze the strawberries in the process!!!

- Blueberries

- 5 strips bacon
 - 1 small bunch Kale

1. Cook bacon until crispy.
 2. When cooked and cooled, cut into small pieces.
 3. Remove kale leaves from stems. Discard stems.
 4. Place kale in sautee pan and drizzle with olive oil.
 5. On medium heat, move kale around pan until it wilts.
 6. Drain beans and warm them in a sauce pan.
 7. In food processor, place beans, kale, lemon juice, olive oil, salt & pepper and bacon. Puree until smooth.
 8. Serve warm with chips and veggies.





The Center of the Universe in Tulsa is a concrete circle, a little more than eight feet in diameter, that is an acoustic anomaly. Any noise made inside the brick circle is loudly echoed, but only those inside the circle can hear it. Amazingly, any of these loud sounds heard inside the circle cannot be heard from outside the perimeter of the brick structure. The Center of the Universe can be accessed in downtown Tulsa from a brick path that leads visitors from the Boston Avenue pedestrian overpass.
